Prior Learning:

During Reception, children have learned to: talk about why things happen and how things work, carry out sorting tasks and understand what is old and what is new in terms of toys, listen to and be told stories about events that have happened to them and their families in the past, listened to the story of the gun powder plot, understand who key people are and how they help us they help us (including the fire service). During Forest School Sessions, children have also learned about fire and fire safety.

Key Historical Vocabulary - history, timeline, memories, old, new, earliest.
Children understand that events that happened beyond our living memory, over 300 years ago, have shaped the world we now live in. Children understand the concept of the past being different to now and can sequence known events in chronological order.

General Terms and Cross Curricular Vocabulary

Fire hook	large rod with a hooked end. These were used to pull down damaged houses or to remove houses to try and stop the fire spreading.	Diary	A book keeping record of daily life
Fire squirt	pump used to suck up water and then squirt it at the fire	Insurance	To pay to protect yourself (against fire)
Gunpowder	a kind of explosive. This was used to blow up houses to try and stop the fire spreading from one building to the next.	Blaze	A bright, strong fire burning fiercely
Fire court	a special group set up after the fire where judges could make decisions about disagreements between building owners and the people who lived in them. Many people disagreed about who should pay for the rebuilding of properties.	Thatch	A roof built of straw

Key Historical Concepts - Top 3 Facts

1. Sir Christopher Wren planned the new city and rebuilding took over 30 years.
2. The fire lasted 5 days contributed to the elimination of the plague.
3. It started at a bakery in Pudding Lane as a spark fell from the oven.
