Prior Learning:

During reception children have

- Applied different methods of joining card and paper and used paper fasteners, glue and masking tape.
- Selected and used basic tools such as scissors and hole punches to help construct a design.

Key DT knowledge and skills:

- There are lots of different types of fabric/textile including felt, cotton, wool, denim, velvet, chiffon or satin
- Fabrics look and feel differently. They can be shiny, matt, soft, rough, patterned or plain.
- Fabrics can be floaty or stiff. Some fabrics hold their shape while others do not. Different fabrics are suitable for different jobs.
- Fabric can be cut using scissors. By using different types of scissors you can make a straight or a patterned edge.
- Different pieces of fabric can be joined together by glueing, tying, stitching, stapling.
- A template can be used to make a shape out of fabric by drawing around the template and then cutting it out of the fabric.
- Fabric can be decorated or embellished with buttons, sequins, beads and stiched patterns. These can be stuck or sticked on to the fabric.
