Prior Learning: In Year 2 pupils will have learnt how to communicate via email, how important the accuracy of the address is, how to use @, how to write short emails, how to add an attachment and how to open and reply to a message as well as how to be respectful when sending emails and not disclose personal information. In Year 3, children we learn to understand computer networks including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the world wide web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration. Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content.
